During the walk, we determined the two poles by the sally port served no purpose. Please confirm to delete these poles.	Yes, these poles can be deleted. Drawings will be updated.
The plans show the overhead power lines approx. 12' from the pole locations. However, the right line is approx. 4' from the center shown on the plans. Legally we have to be 10' away from any power line rated 50kV or below and this poses a huge working hazard. Can the overhead power lines be de-energized during work?	No, the existing power lines cannot be de-energized. The poles should be located as close to the existing
If not, can the existing poles and lights be removed and we attach the fixtures to the new netting poles which we would set closer to the to the fence to avoid hitting the power line that runs between the poles?	fence as possible. If the existing light pole fixtures conflict with the proposed netting location, the netting can be removed within 12" of the fixture. A rope boarder should be installed around the fixture opening.







MINORITY BUSINESS PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

<u>Provide with the bid</u> - Under GS 143-128.2(c) the undersigned bidder shall identify <u>on its bid</u> (Identification of Minority Business Participation Form) the minority businesses that it will use on the project with the total dollar value of the bids that will be performed by the minority businesses. <u>Also</u> list the good faith efforts (Affidavit A) made to solicit minority participation in the bid effort.

NOTE: A contractor that performs all of the work with its <u>own workforce</u> may submit an Affidavit (**B**) to that effect in lieu of Affidavit (**A**) required above. The MB Participation Form must still be submitted even if there is zero participation.

<u>After the bid opening</u> - The Owner will consider all bids and alternates and determine the lowest responsible, responsive bidder. Upon notification of being the apparent low bidder, the bidder shall then file within 72 hours of the notification of being the apparent lowest bidder, the following:

An Affidavit (**C**) that includes a description of the portion of work to be executed by minority businesses, expressed as a percentage of the total contract price, which is <u>equal to or more than the 10% goal</u> established. This affidavit shall give rise to the presumption that the bidder has made the required good faith effort and Affidavit **D** is not necessary;

<u>If less than the 10% goal</u>, Affidavit (**D**) of its good faith effort to meet the goal shall be provided. The document must include evidence of all good faith efforts that were implemented, including any advertisements, solicitations

Note: Bidders must always submit **with their bid** the Identification of Minority Business Participation Form listing all MB contractors, <u>vendors and suppliers</u> that will be used. If there is no MB participation, then enter none or zero on the form. Affidavit A or Affidavit B, as applicable, also must be submitted with the bid. Failure to file a required affidavit or documentation with the bid or after being notified apparent low bidder is grounds for rejection of the bid.
