A. INTRODUCTION

The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools (CMS) Learning & Teaching department is seeking information from potential vendors that can provide a comprehensive Biology, Chemistry, Physical Science and Earth Environmental Science core curriculum solution that aligns with the:

- North Carolina Draft Standard Course of Study (NCSCOS)
- <u>NGSS SEPs and DCIs</u>

B. BACKGROUND

North Carolina is introducing new Biology, Chemistry, Physical Science and Earth Environmental Science standards for the 2024-25 school year and beyond.

CMS is seeking outside potential vendors that will provide a full suite of curricular resources to support instruction that is aligned to the standards, promotes educational equity and culture, empowers educators, and helps all students meet the challenges of more rigorous standards. These principles bolster CMS's vision, mission, <u>Goals and</u> <u>Guardrails</u> and four pillars of excellence.

Responses must address how the resulting curriculum will focus on the instructional core: the participation of **students** in their own education, the knowledge and skill of the **teacher**, and the level and complexity of the **content** students are asked to learn.

All spending will directly support these goals, guardrails, and strategies to ensure all students within our school system are provided with effective core instruction that is standards aligned and rigorous.

C. OBJECTIVES OF THIS RFI

H. CMS Facts

Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools (CMS) is the nation's eighteenth largest school district in the nation and the second largest district in the state of North Carolina, with 118 elementary schools, 49 middle schools, and 33 high schools. CMS offers an extensive range of magnet programs in 37 of these schools to nurture the talents of students who have interest and ability in specific areas. CMS serves over 140,000 students throughout the cities and towns of Mecklenburg County.

CMS is proud of its diverse mix of students who represent 187 different countries and various cultural and ethnic backgrounds. Of these 150,000+ students, 37% identify as African American, 27% identify as white, 25% identify as Hispanic, 7% identify as Asian. Of these students, 29% are identified as English Learners, 9% are identified as Students with Disabilities and 10% are identified as Academically Gifted.
