Scope of Work	The Tryon Palace Historic Site has an existing fence that is stacked stone with chain link fence on top. This chain link fence has become overgrown and is unsightly for a Historic Site. The chain link fence is also in need of repair as it is the security for the Palace grounds. This project will construct a brick wall with capstones on top to match the varying height of the existing stacked stone in front of the existing fence and install wrought iron fencing to the height of the existing chain link fence on top of the brick wall. The Chain link fence will be removed and the space between the new brick wall and stacked stone will be filled in. - 5. Proposed design approach for the project including design team and consultants.
- 6. Recent experience with project costs and schedules.
- 7. Construction administration capabilities.
- 8. Proximity to and familiarity with the area where the project is located.
- 9. Record of successfully completed projects without major legal or technical problems.
- 10. Other factors which may be appropriate for the project.

## STATE BUILDING COMMISSION - SUBMITTAL CRITERIA

Proposing firms must submit THREE (3) copies of the Letter of Interest and THREE (3) copies of your current Standard Form 254 (SF 254) with the information package. The current SF 254 template is located at <a href="http://ncadmin.nc.gov/businesses/construction/forms-documents">http://ncadmin.nc.gov/businesses/construction/forms-documents</a> which is the State Building Commission approved form.

In the interest of cost-savings to the designers, consistency of the submittals and more efficient use of time by the pre-selection committee, the submitted information package should not include any notebooks, binders, tab, clips, etc. The format should be 8-1/2" x 11" pages stapled in the upper left-hand corner. The Letter of Interest should not exceed ten (10) single-sided pages or five (5) double-sided pages plus the SF 254.
