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1.0 PURPOSE AND BACKGROUND

The purpose of this Request for Proposals (RFP) is to solicit proposals from qualified vendors to provide janitorial services to Catawba Valley Community College (CVCC) (Contracting Agency) is responsible for providing efficient, healthy, and safe janitorial service for College buildings. The work shall be performed in strict and complete compliance with the awarded response to the scope of work, specifications, tasks and deliverables, based on industry standards for janitorial products and services, and subject to the terms and conditions herein specified. The Contracting Agency shall perform the administration of the contract.

CVCC is one of the 58 Community Colleges within North Carolina, serving over 4,000 students, faculty, and staff, annually. CVCC offers a wide range of degrees and certificate programs, as well as non-credit courses for workforce development and personal enrichment to include academic, laboratory, offices, restrooms, and classroom spaces. The campus maintains sixteen (16) number of buildings totaling approximately 493,620 square feet. CVCC is located in Catawba County.

The intent of this solicitation is to award an Agency Contract.

1.1 CONTRACT TERM

The Contract shall have an initial term of three (3) years, beginning on July 1, 2026. The Vendor shall make preparations and be ready to begin work under the Contract on this Effective Date.

At the end of the Contract’s initial term, the State shall have the option, in its sole discretion, to renew the Contract on the same terms and conditions for up to two (2) one (1) additional one-year terms. The State will give the Vendor written notice of its intent to exercise each option no later than sixty (60) days before the end of the Contract’s then-current term. In addition to any optional renewal terms, and with the Vendor’s concurrence, the State reserves the right to extend the Contract after the last active term.

2.0 GENERAL INFORMATION

2.1 REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL DOCUMENT

This RFP is comprised of the base RFP document, any attachments, and any addenda released before Contract award, which are incorporated herein by reference.

2.2 NOTICE TO VENDORS REGARDING RFP TERMS AND CONDITIONS

It shall be the Vendor’s responsibility to read the Instructions to Vendors, the North Carolina General Terms and Conditions, all relevant exhibits and attachments, and any other components made a part of this RFP and comply with all requirements and specifications herein. Vendors are also responsible for obtaining and complying with all Addenda and other changes that may be issued in connection with this RFP.

If Vendors have questions or issues regarding any component of this RFP, those must be submitted as questions in accordance with the instructions in the PROPOSAL QUESTIONS Section. If the State determines that any changes will be made as a result of the questions asked, then such decisions will be communicated in the form of an RFP addendum. The State may also elect to leave open the possibility for later negotiation of specific provisions of the Contract that have been addressed during the question-and-answer period, prior to contract award.

Other than through the process of negotiation under 01 NCAC 05B.0503, the State rejects and will not be required to evaluate or consider any additional or modified terms and conditions submitted with Vendor’s proposal or otherwise. This applies to any language appearing in or attached to the document as part of the Vendor’s proposal that purports to vary any terms and conditions or Vendors’ instructions herein or to render the proposal non-binding or subject to

further negotiation. Vendor’s proposal shall constitute a firm offer that shall be held open for the period required herein (“Validity Period” above).

The State may exercise its discretion to consider Vendor proposed modifications. By execution and delivery of this RFP Response, the Vendor agrees that any additional or modified terms and conditions, whether submitted purposely or inadvertently, shall have no force or effect, and will be disregarded unless expressly agreed upon through negotiation and incorporated by way of a Best and Final Offer (BAFO). Noncompliance with, or any attempt to alter or delete, this paragraph shall constitute sufficient grounds to reject Vendor’s proposal as nonresponsive.

Instructions: It shall be MANDATORY that a representative from each Vendor be present for a pre-proposal site visit. Attendees must arrive promptly. All attendees must sign in upon arrival and clearly indicate each prospective Vendor represented on the sign in sheet. LATE ARRIVALS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO SIGN IN OR PARTICIPATE IN THE SITE VISIT, NOR SHALL THEIR PROPOSAL BE CONSIDERED. Once the sign-in process is complete, all other persons wishing to attend may do so to the extent that space and circumstances allow.

FAILURE TO ATTEND THE MANDATORY SITE VISIT SHALL RESULT IN VENDOR’S PROPOSAL BEING DEEMED NON-RESPONSIVE AND NOT CONSIDERED FOR AWARD.

The purpose of this visit is for all prospective Vendors to apprise themselves of the conditions and requirements which will affect the performance of the work called for by this RFP. Vendors must stay for the duration of the site visit. No allowances will be made for unreported conditions that a prudent Vendor would recognize as affecting the work called for or implied by this RFP.

Vendors are cautioned that any information released to attendees during the site visit, other than that involving the physical aspects of the facility referenced above, and which conflicts with, supersedes, or adds to requirements in this RFP, must be confirmed by written addendum before it can be considered to be a part of this RFP.

2.5 PROPOSAL QUESTIONS

Upon review of the RFP documents, Vendors may have questions to clarify or interpret the RFP in order to submit the best proposal possible. To accommodate the Proposal Questions process, Vendors shall submit any such questions by the “Submit Written Questions” date and time provided in the RFP SCHEDULE Section above, unless modified by Addendum.

Written questions shall be emailed to sredd571@cvcc.edu by the date and time specified above. Vendors should enter “RFP # 85-CVCC20271: Questions” as the subject for the email. Question submittals should include a reference to the applicable RFP section and be submitted in the format shown below:

Questions received prior to the submission deadline date, the State’s response, and any additional terms deemed necessary by the State will be posted in the form of an addendum to *the electronic Vendor Portal (eVP)*, <https://evp.nc.gov>, and shall become an Addendum to this RFP. No information, instruction or advice provided orally or informally by any State personnel, whether made in response to a question or otherwise in connection with this RFP, shall be considered authoritative or binding. Vendors shall rely *only* on written material contained in the RFP and an addendum to this RFP.

2.6 PROPOSAL SUBMITTAL

IMPORTANT NOTE: This is an absolute requirement. Late bids, regardless of cause, will not be opened or considered, and will be automatically disqualified from further consideration. Vendor shall bear the sole risk of late submission due to unintended or unanticipated delay. It is the Vendor’s sole responsibility to ensure its proposal has been received as described in this RFP by the specified time and date of opening. The time and date of receipt will be marked on each proposal when received. Any proposal or portion thereof received after the proposal deadline will be rejected.

Electronic Vendor Portal (eVP)

If applicable to this RFP and using eVP, all proposal responses shall be submitted electronically via the electronic Vendor Portal (eVP). Additional information can be found at the eVP updates for Vendors link: <https://eprocurement.nc.gov/news-events/evp-updates-vendors>.

If confidential and proprietary information is included in the proposal, also submit one (1) signed, REDACTED copy of the proposal. Such information may include trade secrets defined by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 66-152 and other information exempted from the Public Records Act pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §132- 1.2. Vendor may designate information, Products, Services or appropriate portions of its response as confidential, consistent with and to the extent permitted under the statutes and rules set forth above. By so redacting any page, or portion of a page, the Vendor warrants that it has formed a good faith opinion, having received such necessary or proper review by counsel and other knowledgeable advisors, that the portions determined to be confidential and proprietary and redacted as such, meet the requirements of the Rules and Statutes set forth above. However, under no circumstances shall price information be designated as confidential.

If the Vendor does not provide a redacted version of the proposal with its proposal submission, the Department may release an unredacted version if a record request is received.

Failure to submit a proposal in strict accordance with these instructions shall constitute sufficient cause to reject a Vendor’s proposal(s). Vendors are strongly encouraged to allow sufficient time to upload proposals.

Critical updated information may be included in Addenda to this RFP. It is important that all Vendors responding to this RFP periodically check the State’s eVP website for any Addenda that may be issued prior to the bid opening date. All Vendors shall be deemed to have read and understood all information in this RFP and all Addenda thereto.

2.7 PROPOSAL CONTENTS

Vendors shall populate all attachments of this RFP that require the Vendor to provide information and include an authorized signature where requested. Failure to provide all required items, or Vendor’s submission of incomplete items, may result in the State rejecting Vendor’s proposal, in the State’s sole discretion.

Vendor RFP responses shall include the following items and attachments, which shall be arranged in the following order:

2.8 ALTERNATE PROPOSALS

Unless provided otherwise in this RFP, Vendor may submit alternate proposals for comparable Goods, various methods or levels of Service(s), or that propose different options. Alternate proposals must specifically identify the RFP requirements and advantage(s) addressed by the alternate proposal. Any alternate proposal, in addition to the marking described above, must be clearly marked with the legend: “Alternate Proposal #85-CVCC20271 [for ‘name of Vendor’]”. Each proposal must be for a specific set of Goods and Services and must include specific pricing. If a Vendor chooses to respond with various offerings, each must be offered with a separate price and be contained in a separate proposal document. Each proposal must be complete and independent of other proposals offered.

2.9 DEFINITIONS, ACRONYMS, AND ABBREVIATIONS

Relevant definitions for this RFP are provided in 01 NCAC 05A .0112 and in the Instructions to Vendors found below which are incorporated herein by this reference.

3.0 METHOD OF AWARD AND PROPOSAL EVALUATION PROCESS

3.1 METHOD OF AWARD

North Carolina G.S. 143-52 provides a general list of criteria the State shall use to award contracts, as supplemented by the additional criteria herein. The Services being procured shall dictate the application and order of criteria; however, all award decisions shall be in the State’s best interest. All qualified proposals will be evaluated, and awards will be made to the Vendor(s) meeting the specific RFP Specifications and achieving the highest and best final evaluation, based on the criteria described below.

The College will use the point system to evaluate the overall proposal from each responsive bidder as outlined in section 3.4.

While the intent of this RFP is to award a Contract(s) to a single Vendor, the State reserves the right to make separate awards to different Vendors for one or more line items, to not award one or more line items or to cancel this RFP in its entirety without awarding a Contract, if it is considered to be most advantageous to the State to do so.

The State reserves the right to waive any minor informality or technicality in proposals received.

3.2 CONFIDENTIALITY AND PROHIBITED COMMUNICATIONS DURING EVALUATION

While this RFP is under evaluation, the responding Vendor, including any subcontractors and suppliers, is prohibited from engaging in conversations intended to influence the outcome of the evaluation. See Paragraph 29 of the Instructions to Vendors entitled COMMUNICATIONS BY VENDORS.

Each Vendor submitting a proposal to this RFP, including its employees, agents, subcontractors, suppliers, subsidiaries and affiliates, is prohibited from having any communications with any person inside or outside the using agency; issuing agency; other government agency office or body (including the procurement lead named above, any department secretary, agency head, members of the General Assembly and Governor’s office); or private entity, if the communication refers to the content of Vendor’s proposal or qualifications, the content of another Vendor’s proposal, another Vendor’s qualifications or ability to perform a resulting contract, and/or the transmittal of any other communication of information that could be reasonably considered to have the effect of directly or indirectly influencing the evaluation of proposals, the award of a contract, or both.

Any Vendor not in compliance with this provision shall be disqualified from evaluation and award. A Vendor’s proposal may be disqualified if its subcontractor and/or supplier engage in any of the foregoing communications during the time that the procurement is active (*i.e.*, the issuance date of the procurement until the date of contract award or cancellation of the procurement). Only those discussions, communications or transmittals of information authorized or initiated by the issuing agency for this RFP or inquiries directed to the procurement lead named in this RFP regarding requirements of the RFP (prior to proposal submission) or the status of the award (after submission) are excepted from this provision.

3.3 PROPOSAL EVALUATION PROCESS

Only responsive submissions will be evaluated.

The State will conduct a One-Step evaluation of Proposals:

Proposals will be received according to the method stated in the Proposal Submittal Section above.

All proposals must be received by the issuing agency not later than the date and time specified in the RFP SCHEDULE Section above, unless modified by Addendum. Vendors are cautioned that this is a request for offers, not an offer or request to contract, and the State reserves the unqualified right to reject any and all offers at any time if such rejection is deemed to be in the best interest of the State.

At the date and time provided in the RFP SCHEDULE Section above, unless modified by Addendum, the proposal from each responding Vendor will be opened publicly and all offers (except those that have been previously withdrawn, or voided bids) will be tabulated. The tabulation shall be made public at the time it is created. When negotiations after receipt of bids are authorized pursuant to G.S. 143-49 and 01 NCAC 05B.0503, only the names of offerors and the Goods and Services offered shall be tabulated at the time of opening. If negotiation is anticipated, cost and price shall become available for public inspection at the time of the award. Interested parties

are cautioned that these costs and their components are subject to further evaluation for completeness and correctness and therefore may not be an exact indicator of a Vendor’s pricing position.

At their option, the evaluators may request oral presentations or discussions with any or all Vendors for clarification or to amplify the materials presented in any part of the proposal. Vendors are cautioned, however, that the evaluators are not required to request presentations or other clarification—and often do not. Therefore, all proposals should be complete and reflect the most favorable terms available from the Vendor.

Upon completion of the technical evaluation, the cost proposals of those Vendors whose technical proposals have been deemed acceptable will be publicly opened. The total cost offered by each Vendor will be tabulated and become a matter of public record. Interested parties are cautioned that these costs and their components are subject to further evaluation for completeness and correctness and therefore may not be an exact indicator of a Vendor’s pricing position.

If negotiation is anticipated under 01 NCAC 05B.0503, pricing may not be public until award.

Upon completion of the evaluation process, the State will make award(s) based on the evaluation and post the award(s) to the State’s eVP website under the RFP number for this solicitation. Award of a Contract to one Vendor does not mean that the other proposals lacked merit, but that, all factors considered, the selected proposal was deemed most advantageous and represented the best value to the State.

The State reserves the right to negotiate with one or more vendors, or to reject all original offers and negotiate with one or more sources of supply that may be capable of satisfying the requirement, and in either case to require Vendor to submit a Best and Final Offer (BAFO) based on discussions and negotiations with the State.

3.4 EVALUATION CRITERIA

In addition to the general criteria in G.S. 143-52 which may or may not be relevant to this RFP, all qualified proposals will be evaluated, and award made based on considering the following criteria, to result in an award most advantageous to the State:

a. Years of Experience

4. §5.15 Technical Approach Maximum of Points 20

5. Attachment A – Pricing - Maximum of 30 Points

3.5 PERFORMANCE OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES

Vendor shall complete ATTACHMENT F: LOCATION OF WORKERS UTILIZED BY VENDOR. In addition to any other evaluation criteria identified in this RFP, the State may also consider, for purposes of evaluating proposed or actual contract performance outside of the United States, how that performance may affect the following factors to ensure that any award will be in the best interest of the State:

- a) Total cost to the State
- b) Level of quality provided by the Vendor
- c) Process and performance capability across multiple jurisdictions
- d) Protection of the State’s information and intellectual property
- e) Availability of pertinent skills
- f) Ability to understand the State’s business requirements and internal operational culture
- g) Particular risk factors such as the security of the State’s information technology
- h) Relations with citizens and employees
- i) Contract enforcement jurisdictional issues

3.6 INTERPRETATION OF TERMS AND PHRASES

This RFP serves two functions: (1) to advise potential Vendors of the parameters of the solution being sought by the State; and (2) to provide (together with other specified documents) the terms of the Contract resulting from this procurement. The use of phrases such as “shall,” “must,” and “requirements” are intended to create enforceable contract conditions. In determining whether proposals should be evaluated or rejected, the State will take into consideration the degree to which Vendors have proposed or failed to propose solutions that will satisfy the State’s needs as described in the RFP. Except as specifically stated in the RFP, no one requirement shall automatically disqualify a Vendor from consideration. However, failure to comply with any single requirement may result in the State exercising its discretion to reject a proposal in its entirety.

4.0 REQUIREMENTS

This Section lists the requirements related to this RFP. By submitting a proposal, the Vendor agrees to meet all stated requirements in this Section as well as any other specifications, requirements, and terms and conditions stated in this RFP. If a Vendor is unclear about a requirement or specification, or believes a change to a requirement would allow for the State to receive a better proposal, the Vendor is urged to submit these items in the form of a question during the question-and-answer period in accordance with the Proposal Questions Section above.

4.1 PRICING

Proposal price shall constitute the total cost to the State for complete performance in accordance with the requirements and specifications herein, including all applicable charges for handling, transportation, administrative and other similar fees. Complete ATTACHMENT A: PRICING FORM and include in Vendor’s proposal. The pricing provided in ATTACHMENT A, or resulting from any negotiations, is incorporated herein and shall become part of any resulting Contract.

4.1.1 Import Tariff Temporary Surcharge

Pricing shall be exclusive of any pending tariffs or temporary tariff surcharge. Vendor may request a temporary tariff surcharge in ATTACHMENT A: PRICING as a charge separate from the contract price. Any temporary tariff surcharge(s) associated with purchases shall be provided by way of a percentage tariff surcharge. All tariff surcharges proposed are intended to be temporary and based on current tariff implications specific to related commodities with evidence of submitted documentation of affected MSRP products. Vendor understands that the agency may request additional justification. Any temporary tariff surcharge percentage will be negotiated and mutually agreed upon. The state is not obligated to accept any proposed import tariff surcharge. Proposed tariff surcharges may be used as a factor for evaluation and award.

4.2 HUB PARTICIPATION

Pursuant to North Carolina General Statute G.S. 143-48, it is State policy to encourage and promote the use of small, minority, physically handicapped, and women contractors in purchasing Goods and Services. As such, this RFP will serve to identify those Vendors that are minority owned or have a strategic plan to support the State’s Historically Underutilized Business program by meeting or exceeding the goal of 10% utilization of diverse firms as 1st or 2nd tier subcontractors. Vendor shall complete ATTACHMENT D: HUB SUPPLEMENTAL VENDOR INFORMATION.

4.3 VENDOR EXPERIENCE

In its Proposal, Vendor shall demonstrate experience with public and/or private sector clients with similar or greater size and complexity to CVCC and performed within the last year. Vendor shall provide information as to the qualifications and experience of all executive, managerial, legal, and professional personnel to be assigned to this project, including resumes citing experience with similar projects and the responsibilities to be assigned to each person. Additionally, Vendor shall demonstrate the following:

1. A minimum of five (5) years of experience in the janitorial business.
2. Project manager and supervisory personnel for this work effort must have a minimum of three (3) years of experience with projects of similar size and scope to those described herein.

4.4 REFERENCES

Vendor shall provide at least three (3) references, using ATTACHMENT E: CUSTOMER REFERENCE FORM, for which it has provided Services of similar size and scope to those proposed herein. References shall not be from the same company. In addition, Vendor shall provide references for and identify other government contracts it has received, for which your company has provided services of similar size and scope. The State *shall* contact these users to determine whether the Services provided are substantially similar in scope to those proposed herein and whether Vendor’s performance has been satisfactory. The information obtained *shall* be considered in the evaluation of the Proposal.

4.5 BACKGROUND CHECKS

Vendor and its personnel are required to provide or undergo background checks at Vendor's expense prior to beginning work with the State. **These background checks must cover local and national levels.** As part of Vendor background, the following details must be provided to the State:

- a) Any **criminal felony conviction**, or conviction of any crime involving moral turpitude, including, but not limited to fraud, misappropriation or deception, by Vendor, its officers or directors, or any of its employees or other personnel to provide Services on this project, of which Vendor has knowledge, or provide a statement that Vendor is aware of none;
- b) Any **criminal investigation** for any offense involving moral turpitude, including, but not limited to fraud, misappropriation, falsification or deception pending against Vendor of which it has knowledge, or provide a statement Vendor is aware of none;
- c) Any **regulatory sanctions** levied against Vendor or any of its officers, directors or its professional employees expected to provide Services on this project by any state or federal regulatory agencies within the past three years or a statement that there are none. As used herein, the term "regulatory sanctions" includes the revocation or suspension of any license or certification, the levying of any monetary penalties or fines, and the issuance of any written warnings;
- d) Any **regulatory investigations** pending against Vendor or any of its officers, directors or its professional employees expected to provide Services on this project by any state or federal regulatory agencies of which Vendor has knowledge or a statement that there are none.
- e) Any **civil litigation**, arbitration, proceedings, or judgments pending against Vendor during the three (3) years preceding submission of its proposal herein or a statement that there are none.

Vendor's response to these requests shall be considered a continuing representation, and Vendor's failure to notify the State within thirty (30) days of any criminal litigation, investigation or proceeding involving Vendor or its then current officers, directors or persons providing Services under this Contract during its term shall constitute a material breach of contract. The provisions of this paragraph shall also apply to any subcontractor utilized by Vendor to perform Services under this Contract.

4.5.1. GENERAL INFORMATION

It is the policy of the State to provide a safe environment for State Government employees to work. Due to the Contract requirements, the State requires criminal background checks of awarded Vendors, including but not limited to: owners, employees, agents, representatives, subcontractors, and all personnel of their respective companies. All costs and expenses associated with criminal background checks are the responsibility of the Vendor.

The following requirements must be met:

- a) Criminal background checks shall be current and completed within ninety (90) days of the Contract effective date.
- b) The criminal background check shall include a social security verification/check, felonies, misdemeanors, and traffic records covering a minimum of the last seven (7) years for all states and countries where the individual has resided. The criminal background check information shall be first thoroughly reviewed by the Vendor and then sent to the Contract Administrator for review and approval. Out-of-state searches shall be required for persons living in the

state of NC for fewer than seven (7) years. Fingerprint background checks may be required in some instances depending on the facility requirements.

- c) A criminal background check on the awarded Vendor and its employees shall be provided by the Vendor prior to Contract effective date. Copies of the original criminal background check shall be sent to the Contract Administrator for evaluation. In some cases, badging cannot take place until after the evaluation and approval of the Vendor's criminal checks.
- d) When a new employee or individual is identified to perform Services on this Contract, the Vendor shall provide the Contract Administrator with a criminal background check before the individual can be approved for work. Persons without approved criminal background checks shall not be allowed to work in the relevant buildings until proper documentation is submitted and approved.
- e) The State may require the Vendor to exclude the Vendor's employees, agents, representatives, or subcontractors based on background check results. Discovery that one or more employees have convictions does not disqualify the Vendor from award.
- f) Additionally, the State may use The North Carolina Department of Public Safety Offender Public Information or similar Services to conduct additional background checks on the Vendor's proposed employees.

4.5.2 BACKGROUND CHECK LIMITATIONS

Any individual representing the Vendor, who:

- a) In his/her lifetime, has been adjudicated as a habitual felon as defined by GS 14-7.1 or a violent habitual felon as defined by GS 14-7.7, shall not be allowed to work in buildings occupied by State Government employees.
- b) During the last seven (7) years has been convicted of any criminal felony or misdemeanor sexual offense or a crime of violence shall not be allowed to work in buildings occupied by State Government employees.
- c) At any time has an outstanding warrant or a criminal charge for a crime described in (b) above shall not be allowed to work on State property.
- d) The Vendor must ensure that all employees have a responsibility to self-report to the Vendor within twenty-four (24) hours any arrest for any disqualifying offense. The Vendor must notify the Contract Administrator within twenty-four (24) hours of all details concerning any reported arrest.
- e) Upon the request of the Contract Administrator, the Vendor will re-screen any of its employees, agents, representatives, and subcontractors during the term of the Contract.
- f) Vendor's responses to these background check requests shall be considered a continuing representation, and Vendor's failure to notify the State within thirty (30) days of any criminal charge, investigation, or proceeding involving Vendor or its then-current officers, directors or persons providing Services under this Contract during its term shall constitute a material breach of contract. The provisions of this paragraph shall also apply to any subcontractor utilized by Vendor to perform Services under this Contract.
- g) If there are problems or delays with performance associated with the completion and compliance with this background check requirements, any Vendor's performance bond could be used to complete these Services.

4.5.3 DOCUMENT REQUIREMENTS

Required documentation to be submitted prior to date Contract is effective and for performing any Services on State property shall include:

- a) A cover letter by the Vendor on company letterhead with a list of the full names matching a required government issued photo ID, addresses, and birth dates of each person representing the contracting company.
- b) Vendor shall also provide a photocopy of the required State or Federal government issued picture ID or Driver License.
- c) A letter on company letterhead is not acceptable proof in itself but can be used to further clarify information on the criminal background check submitted. All documentation shall be submitted at the same time. Submit documents which are clear and legible.
- d) Background checks consisting of:
 - 1. Original unaltered criminal background check from the organization providing the background check.
 - 2. The background check provider’s company name, company mailing address, and contact phone numbers.
 - 3. The full name of the individual, which matches the government issued photo ID.
 - 4. The current address of individual being checked.
 - 5. The date the criminal background check search was conducted.

4.6 PERSONNEL

Vendor warrants that qualified personnel shall provide Services under this Contract in a professional manner. “Professional manner” means that the personnel performing the Services will possess the skill and competence consistent with the prevailing business standards in the industry. Vendor will serve as the prime contractor under this Contract and shall be responsible for the performance and payment of all subcontractor(s) that may be approved by the State. Names of any third-party Vendors or subcontractors of Vendor may appear for purposes of convenience in Contract documents; and shall not limit Vendor’s obligations hereunder. Vendor will retain executive representation for functional and technical expertise as needed in order to incorporate any work by third party subcontractor(s).

Should the Vendor’s proposal result in an award, the Vendor shall be required to agree that it will not substitute key personnel assigned to the performance of the Contract without prior written approval by the Contract Lead. Vendor shall further agree that it will notify the Contract Lead of any desired substitution, including the name(s) and references of Vendor’s recommended substitute personnel. The State will approve or disapprove the requested substitution in a timely manner. The State may, in its sole discretion, terminate the Services of any person providing Services under this Contract. Upon such termination, the State may request acceptable substitute personnel or terminate the contract Services provided by such personnel.

4.7 VENDOR’S REPRESENTATIONS

If Vendor’s Proposal results in an award, Vendor agrees that it will not enter any agreement with a third party that may abridge any rights of the State under the Contract. If any Services, deliverables, functions, or responsibilities not specifically described in this solicitation are required for Vendor’s proper performance, provision and delivery of the Service and deliverables under a resulting Contract, or are an inherent part of or necessary sub-task included within such Service, they will be deemed to be implied by and included within the scope of the Contract to the same extent and in the same manner as if specifically described in the Contract. Unless otherwise expressly provided herein, Vendor will furnish all of its own necessary management, supervision, labor, facilities, furniture, computer and telecommunications equipment, software, supplies and materials necessary for the Vendor to provide and deliver the Services and/or other Deliverables.

4.8 FINANCIAL STABILITY

As a condition of contract award, the Vendor must certify that it has the financial capacity to perform and to continue to perform its obligations under the Contract; that Vendor has no constructive or actual knowledge of an actual or potential legal proceeding being brought against Vendor that could materially adversely affect performance of this Contract; and that entering into this Contract is not prohibited by any contract, or order by any court of competent jurisdiction

Each Vendor shall certify it is financially stable by completing the ATTACHMENT G: CERTIFICATION OF FINANCIAL CONDITION. The State is requiring this certification to minimize potential performance issues from Contracting with a Vendor that is financially unstable. This Certification shall be deemed continuing, and from the date of the Certification to the expiration of the Contract, the Vendor shall notify the State within thirty (30) days of any occurrence or condition that materially alters the truth of any statement made in this Certification.

4.9 AGENCY INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS MODIFICATION

4.10 SUBCONTRACTORS

No portion of the work shall be subcontracted without prior written consent of the State. In the event that the Vendor desires to subcontract some part of the work specified herein, the Vendor shall furnish with their bid the names, qualifications, and experience of their proposed subcontractors. The Vendor shall, however, remain solely and fully liable and responsible for the work done by its subcontractor(s) and shall assure compliance with all the requirements and specifications of the contract.

- A. This contract and all rights and responsibilities under the contract documents may not be assigned by the Vendor.
- B. All regular supervisory and janitorial personnel involved in the performance of this contract shall be directly employed by and supervised by the Vendor. Subcontracting of any work under this contract must have specific, prior written approval by the College.

4.11 SECRETARY OF STATE REGISTRATION

Prior to entering into a contract with the State, the awarded Vendor(s) must complete registration with the NC Secretary of State. Upon notification of award, the selected Vendor(s) must furnish evidence of filing within 10 business days. Failure to provide this documentation may result in the disqualification of the Vendor(s) bid from further consideration for the award. 5.4 TASKS/DELIVERABLES

The specific items and any specifications that the CVCC is seeking are listed below. Items offered by the vendor must meet or exceed the listed specifications to be considered for award.

CVCC shall provide the Vendor with all normal utilities necessary for the performance of the contract.

1. MATERIALS, SUPPLIES, TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT

All costs associated with the Vendor providing the materials and supplies shall be included in the response to this RFP.
 - 1. Materials specified for the work shall be acceptable for the intended application. Only commercial quality cleaning supplies shall be used. Sanitizers, sterilizers, and disinfectants shall be EPA registered and approved for effective use against blood borne pathogens,

including hepatitis B and HIV. All containers, applicators and bottles shall be labeled with the products name which they contain.

2. The Vendor shall provide all can liner, eight (8) mil thickness to prevent rupture and spillage. Nightly changes of can liner is NOT required if the product is not soiled or contaminated.
3. Vendor shall maintain one (1) week’s supply of all products on site at all times.
4. Vendor shall provide employees with an identification badge or a uniform that must be displayed/worn at all times while on Campus. The Company, employees name and picture is to be provided on the badge or the Company and employees name shall be displayed on the uniform.

5.5 RECYCLING/WASTE REDUCTION

The College provides desk side recycling containers in all offices and copy rooms. The College provides beverage container recycling bins near break and vending areas and corridors. The College has setup and maintains centralized recycling sites (typically one per building).

These centralized recycling sites will include containers for three (3) separate materials to include:

1. Aluminum Containers
2. Office type Paper and Newspaper/Magazines
3. Plastic bottles

The Vendor shall be responsible for taking cardboard boxes to the cardboard pick up area located at the nearest dumpster. CVCC occupants will place cardboard in corridors or mark "TRASH" on the side and place on floor for recycling.

The Vendor shall perform any recycling duties as it relates to emptying bins or containers. Bins and containers shall be taken to the curb between the Dental Hygiene building and the Welding Building, or to the area behind the Cyler Dunbar building, for pickup by Republic Services.

5.6 MANPOWER

A. Supervision: The Vendor shall provide sufficient on-site supervision as is essential to carry out all the terms and conditions of this contract. The Vendor shall provide the Contract Manager with the name, location, cellular telephone number and E-mail address of the Supervisor specifically designated for this contract. The Supervisor shall be available at all times, while contract work is in progress, to receive notices, reports or requests from the Contract Manager. The single point of contact and other supervisory employees/job managers must be able to read, write and speak English. The single point Supervisor will be capable of correcting reported discrepancies as necessary within 4 (four) hours as needed.

1. The Vendor shall provide an on-site Supervisor at night while work is being performed.

2. At a minimum, the Supervisor to janitorial workers ratio will be at least 1 Supervisor per 26 janitorial workers.

B. Standards of Conduct: The Vendor shall be responsible for maintaining exceptional standards of employee work performance, conduct, appearance and integrity, and shall be responsible for taking such disciplinary action with respect to employees as may be necessary. The Vendor shall be responsible for ensuring that employees do not disturb papers on desks, open desk drawers or cabinets, use College telephones, computers, or other media type equipment except when authorized. Each employee is expected to adhere to standards of behavior that reflect favorably on the Vendor and the College. The College reserves the right to request removal of employees that the Contract Manager deems to have demonstrated unsatisfactory performance, behavior or conduct.

C. Security

1. The Vendor shall comply with all security requirements in the building(s) where work is being performed or in a space which must be accessed in the performance of work. All security requirements must be met and employees cleared, as may be required prior to the Vendor performing work in the area. Employees that do not meet security requirements will not be allowed to work. Employee clearance shall include background checks, paid for by the Vendor and copies provided to the College.
2. Vendor’s employees shall not remove any articles from the facilities regardless of its value, and regardless of any employee’s permission. This includes any item found in the trash.
3. Employees shall not leave keys in doors or admit anyone into any building or office that is not a designated employee of the Vendor. All doors, which were locked upon entry, shall be immediately relocked. All lights shall be turned on as the space is cleaned and turned off when leaving.

D. Vendor Personnel

The College reserves the right to approve changes in supervisory and project manager personnel, and any other key personnel working under this contract.

5.7 ACCESS TO BUILDINGS

- A. Access to the buildings shall be provided as outlined under Section 5.10 Key/Lock/Security System Control.
- B. Security alarm code(s) will be furnished to the Vender for access to the facilities as deemed necessary by the College. Under **no** circumstances shall the codes be distributed or revealed to others.
- C. Vendor employees shall not be accompanied in their work areas on the premises by acquaintances, family members or any other person unless that person is an authorized Vendor employee.

5.8 EMERGENCIES

The Vendor shall maintain service every day and require entire work force assigned to CVCC to be available to secure the facilities for protection of life and property in the event of emergencies due to snow, ice or disaster such as, but not limited to, hurricanes, tornadoes, floods and fires. The Vendor or employees shall perform all work as directed by the Contract Manager and shall keep all pertinent records of work performed.

5.9 DRUG FREE WORKPLACE

- A. The Vendor acknowledges and certifies that it understands that the following acts by the Vendor, its employees and/or agents performing services on campus property are prohibited:
 - 1. The unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of alcohol or other drugs; and
 - 2. Any impairment or incapacitation from the use of alcohol or other drugs (except the use of drugs for legitimate medical purposes).
- B. The Vendor further acknowledges that by executing this contract it understands that a violation of these prohibitions constitutes a breach of contract and may result in termination of this contract and may result in criminal penalties.

5.10 KEY/LOCK/SECURITY SYSTEM CONTROL

Keys or cards for access to buildings will be provided by the College to the Vendor. The Vendor’s supervisor will issue keys/cards daily and check the keys/cards back in prior to the end of the shift. No College keys/cards shall leave campus. The Contract Manager may conduct periodic unannounced key inventories. No deposits shall be required; however, the Vendor shall be responsible for the cost of lost keys/card or lock rekeying. There shall be a \$10.00 charge per key, \$25 charge per card; rekeying charges will be actual costs plus 10%. LOST KEYS MUST BE REPORTED TO CAMPUS SECURITY IMMEDIATELY and PLANT OPERATIONS.

At the end of the contract, all keys and cards shall be returned to the Contract Administrator on the last effective date of the contract. The final invoice for this contract will not be paid until all keys and or cards are returned and any charges for those not returned or rekeying charges have been collected.

Employees shall not leave keys in doors or unsecure places. All doors which were locked upon entry shall be immediately relocked. Under no circumstance shall any door be opened and the space left unattended.

Security system codes will be provided to the Vendor for entry. System(s) shall be rearmed when the user completes the tasks or departs from an unoccupied building. Information related to the security and operation of premises is protected and not to be discussed with anyone except employees working directly for the Vendor. Breach of security of a building shall be grounds for breach of Contract.

5.11 SAFETY AND HEALTH

- A. General: The Vendor shall maintain or establish a complete safety and health program to assure safety of Vendor employees, and College students and staff. This program will include employee training, personal protective equipment, hazardous materials and equipment, blood borne pathogens, safe equipment operation, policies and procedures.
- B. Accident Reporting: Serious accidents including but not limited to those resulting in treatment of an injury at a medical facility, response to the site by emergency medical personnel, lost work time or damage to property other than that of the Vendor shall be reported to the Contract Administrator by telephone within twenty-four (24) hours of the occurrence. A copy of each accident report, which the Vendor or Subcontractors at any level, submits to their insurance carriers in regard to accidents occurring in relation to this contract shall be forwarded to the Contract Administrator as soon as possible, but no later than seven (7) calendar days after such occurrence.

5.12 PARKING

All CVCC parking lots are patrolled by Security Officers. Each vehicle parked on campus must display a permit while parking in CVCC spaces. Parking permits shall be provided to the Vendors employees free of charge. Parking rules and regulations are posted on the CVCC (www.cvcc.edu) web site or available in print at the Security Office. It is the responsibility of the Vendor to secure and display proper permits on all vehicles while on campus and shall be responsible for any violation fees associated with non-compliance with parking regulations.

5.13 SCHEDULE OF JANITORIAL SERVICE

- A. General: Advanced janitorial services shall be performed in accordance with this RFP and by established cleaning methods and standards. The task and frequency of janitorial services shall be performed as needed to maintain the facilities to the level specified. A description of the tasks are listed in section 5.4 TASKS.

Employees shall not clean, unplug or move copy machines or other office machines without the permission from the Contract Manager.

- B. The Vendor shall perform the work after 9:30 pm daily and before 6:30 am the next day. The night cleaning shall occur five (5) days per week, Monday night through Friday night and Saturday as needed and scheduled with the Contract Manager.
- C. To assist with daily operations, at least five (5) people must be on site Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and Saturday as needed to clean the rest rooms and other general cleaning including but not limited to emergencies as needed.
- D. One (1) person must be on site Monday through Friday 4:00 pm to 9:30 pm to clean restrooms and other general cleaning including but not limited to emergencies as needed.
- E. The Vendor shall provide a schedule for stripping and re-waxing at least five (5) days in advance. The Vendor must coordinate strip and re-waxing activities with the Contract Manager.
- F. The Vendor shall also be required to respond to non-routine tasks. The College will compensate the Vendor for this additional work as outlined in the hourly rates in Attachment A: Pricing. Typical non-routine tasks include:
 - 1. Special detailing or cleaning for a special event.
 - 2. Responding to emergencies such as water spills when staff are not on site, or that requires special equipment.
 - 3. Weekend cleaning for special events.

- G. The College is normally closed on the following holidays. Except as outlined otherwise, cleaning of facilities is not required on these days:

- H. The College operates a 24-hour per day security center to dispatch service calls after normal day operations. The Vendor shall respond to service calls when contacted and approved by the Contractor Manager. When contacted by the Contract Manager, the Vendor shall respond and go to the site if already on campus, or come to campus if not on campus, to cleanup emergencies. Emergencies include items such as major leaks. The Vendor shall receive additional compensation for responding to emergencies when staff is not already on site, or if the emergency requires special equipment. The Vendor shall provide the Contract Manager one contact phone number for use in emergencies.

5.14 PROJECT ORGANIZATION

Vendor shall describe the organizational and operational structure it proposes to utilize for the work described in this RFP and identify the responsibilities to be assigned to each person Vendor proposes to staff the work.

5.15 TECHNICAL APPROACH

Vendor's proposal shall include, in narrative, outline, and/or graph form the Vendor's approach to accomplishing the tasks outlined in the Scope of Work section of this RFP. A description of each task and deliverable and the schedule for accomplishing each shall be included.

Vendors shall provide a list of equipment and verification of any specifications required.

5.16 COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS AND REGULATIONS

- A. Vendor agrees that it, its agents and employees shall comply with all municipal, county, state and federal laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances applicable to the work to be performed under any resulting contract including but not limited to health, fire, public safety, and environmental regulations. Vendor shall obtain all necessary permits, pay all license fees and taxes to comply therewith.
- B. Vendor agrees that it, its agents and employees shall comply with all municipal, county, state and federal laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances applicable to the work to be performed under any resulting contract including but not limited to health, fire, public safety, and environmental regulations. Vendor shall obtain all necessary permits, pay all license fees and taxes to comply therewith.
- C. Vendor agrees that it, its agents, subcontractors, and employees will abide by all rules, regulations, and policies of CVCC during the term of this contract, including any renewal periods.
- D. Firearms are not permitted on campus property per State and Federal Law. Violators will be arrested and punished to the full extent of the law.
- E. The Vendor shall comply with all applicable Occupational Safety and Health Act and Regulations. The Vendor shall train, at no cost to CVCC, their employees and sub-contractors in proper handling of blood borne pathogens OSHA-29 CFR 1910.1030 and use such procedures when blood and /or any other bodily fluids are involved. Employees shall be trained before engaging in work.

- F. The Vendor shall train, at no cost to CVCC, their employees and subcontractors in proper handling of asbestos contained materials. The materials are primarily in tile flooring. The asbestos training shall comply with OSHA standards 29CFR 1910.1001 and 1926.1101.

6.0 CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION

All Contract Administration requirements are conditioned on an award resulting from this solicitation. This information is provided for the Vendor’s planning purposes.

6.2 INVOICES

Vendor shall invoice the Procurement Entity. The standard format for invoicing shall be Single Invoices meaning that the Vendor shall provide the Procurement Entity with an invoice for each order. Invoices shall include detailed

information to allow Procurement Entity to verify pricing at point of receipt matches the correct price from the original date of order. The following fields shall be included on all invoices, as relevant:

6.2.1 INVOICES FOR ROUTINE WORK

Vendor shall invoice CVCC for completed performance of the routine work in compliance with the contract documents, CVCC shall pay the Vendor monthly, after the approval of the invoice, an amount equal to the approved monthly cost.

The Vendor shall provide invoices for monthly services within seven (7) working day to the end of the billable month. Invoices shall include a total for all facilities.

All terms of this contract are dependent upon and subject to allocation of funds for the purpose set forth in this RFP.

Vendor shall be paid a fixed price on a monthly basis.

6.2.2 INVOICES FOR ADDITIONAL WORK

The Vendor shall submit an invoice to CVCC for additional work, which has been approved and completed to the satisfaction of the Contract Administration.

INVOICES MAY NOT BE PAID UNTIL AN INSPECTION HAS OCCURRED AND THE GOODS OR SERVICES ACCEPTED

6.3 POST AWARD BUSINESS REVIEW MEETINGS

The Vendor, at the request of the State, shall be required to meet periodically *monthly* with the State for Business Review meetings. The purpose of these meetings will be to review project progress reports, discuss Vendor and State performance, address outstanding issues, review problem resolution, provide direction, evaluate continuous improvement and cost saving ideas, and discuss any other pertinent topics.

6.4 CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

The State encourages the Vendor to identify opportunities to reduce the total cost to the State. A continuous improvement effort consists of various ways to enhance business efficiencies as performance progresses.

6.5 VENDOR’S PERFORMANCE

In the event the Contract Manager discovers that cleaning standards are not being maintained, the Vendor shall be given one (1) business day to clean the area in question to the required level.

6.6 DEDUCTIONS FOR NON-PERFORMANCE OF WORK

A. The value of a deduction of hours for non-performance of routine work shall be determined by the Contract Manager. In the event of non-performance, the Contract Manager may:

1. Notify the Vendor in writing via email of the non-performance.
2. Cause the incorrect or omitted work to be corrected by CVCC employees.
3. Cause the incorrect or omitted work to be corrected by outside sources.

B. If, after being notified of non-performance, the Vendor does not correct the situation, the Vendor shall then reimburse CVCC for any cost of correcting the substandard performance from other sources at an hourly rate

of \$45.00 per hour. This rate represents the cost of internal personnel, including base wages, payroll taxes, insurance, and administrative overhead required to rectify contracted tasks not complete.

- C. Default - Repeated incidents of unsatisfactory performance or failure to comply with the terms of the contract may result in a recommendation for termination for default by the Contract Manager, as will be documented through Request to Cure Notices and Vendor Responses.
- D. If the Vendor receives three (3) or more deductions, or notices of unsatisfactory performance per week in two (2) consecutive weeks, or more than a total of twenty (20) deductions during a twelve (12) month period, the contract may be in default and terminated for cause.
- E. Termination for cause of any portion of the contract may result in termination of the entire contract for default at the discretion of the College.

6.7 OTHER CONTRACTS

The College may undertake or award other contracts for additional work and the Vendor shall fully cooperate with other contractors and College employees. The Vendor shall not commit or permit any act, which may interfere with the performance of work by another contractor, or by College employees. The College reserves the right to utilize the services of any contractor to provide any type of janitorial services in the facilities not covered in this RFP.

6.8 PERIODIC QUARTLERY STATUS REPORTS

The Vendor shall be required to provide Management Reports to the designated Contract Manager on a quarterly basis. This report shall include, at a minimum, information concerning inspections conducted by the Contract Administrator, as well as accomplishments, operational issues, and a work plan for the following quarter. These reports shall be well organized and easy to read. The Vendor shall submit these reports electronically using Microsoft Excel and, as needed, either Microsoft PowerPoint or Microsoft Word. The Vendor shall submit the reports in a timely manner and on a regular schedule as agreed by the parties.

Within fifteen (15) business days of the award of the Contract the Vendor shall submit a final work plan and a sample report, to the designated Contract Manager for approval.

The Vendor is hereby notified that activities, functions and reports either directly or indirectly in support of this contract are subject to both scheduled and unscheduled audits by CVCC officials. The Vendor shall make all documents related to the contract immediately available to officials for review.

6.9 MATERIAL DATA SHEETS

Within fifteen (15) business days of the award of the Contract the Vendor shall submit Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) along with a complete listed inventory of all materials and supplies prior to contract start. The Vendor shall not bring any material on site requiring an MSDS without prior approval from the Contract Administrator. A notebook/ ring binder containing all of the MSDS sheets shall be kept in the storage area where the chemical reside. The MSDS sheets shall match the chemicals in that location as well as those used during cleaning.

6.10 ACCEPTANCE OF WORK

- A. Performance of the work shall be conducted and completed at least in accordance with the Contract requirements and recognized and customarily accepted industry practices. Performance shall be considered complete when the Services are approved as acceptable by the Contract Administrator.
- B. The College has the right to inspect all areas for compliance during the contract. The College shall perform inspections and test in a manner that will not unduly delay the Vendor from completing work required by this contract.
- C. Un-announced random inspections shall be made at any time, by a representative of the College. The inspector shall document the results of these inspections. The Inspector shall provide a copy of the results to the Contract Administrator, Purchasing Agent and the Vendor. The Vendor shall communicate the results from College the inspection to the Vendors cleaning personnel. The Vendor shall be responsible for corrections of the deficiencies within twenty-four (24) hours or a mutually agreed deadline as negotiated by the Vendor and CVCC.
- D. Should the work or deliverables fail to meet any specifications, acceptance criteria or otherwise fail to conform to the Contract, the State may exercise any and all rights provided by the Uniform Commercial Code, as adopted in North Carolina.

6.11 FAITHFUL PERFORMANCE

Upon award, the awarded Vendor shall provide a performance bond. The value of the performance bond shall be the total dollar amount equal to four (4) months of the contract price and shall remain in force during the duration of the contract, including extension(s). The performance bond shall be delivered to the purchasing office no later than fifteen (15) days after written notification of award.

6.12 TRANSITION ASSISTANCE

If a Contract results from this solicitation, and the Contract is not renewed at the end of the last active term, or is canceled prior to its expiration, for any reason, Vendor shall provide transition assistance to the State, at the option of the State, for up to 90 days to allow for the expired or canceled portion of the Services to continue without interruption or adverse effect, and to facilitate the orderly transfer of such Services to the State or its designees. If the State exercises this option, the Parties agree that such transition assistance shall be governed by the terms and conditions of the Contract (notwithstanding this expiration or cancellation), except for those Contract terms or conditions that do not reasonably apply to such transition assistance. The State shall agree to pay Vendor for any resources utilized in performing such transition assistance at the most current rates provided by the Contract for performance of the Services or other resources utilized.

6.13 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

During the performance of the Contract, the parties agree that it is in their mutual interest to resolve disputes informally. Any claims by the Vendor shall be submitted in writing to the State’s Contract Manager for resolution. Any claims by the State shall be submitted in writing to the Vendor’s Project Manager for resolution. The Parties shall agree to negotiate in good faith and use all reasonable efforts to resolve such dispute(s).

During the time the Parties are attempting to resolve any dispute, each shall proceed diligently to perform their respective duties and responsibilities under this Contract. The Parties will agree on a reasonable amount of time to resolve a dispute. If a dispute cannot be resolved between the Parties within the agreed upon period, either Party may elect to exercise any other remedies available under the Contract, or at law. This provision, when agreed in the Contract, shall not constitute an agreement by either party to mediate or arbitrate any dispute.

6.14 CONTRACT CHANGES

Contract changes, if any, over the life of the Contract shall be implemented by contract amendments agreed to in writing by the State and Vendor. Amendments to the contract can only be through the Contract Manager.

6.15 CONTRACT PRICING

Prices proposed by the Vendor shall be firm against any increase for *three hundred and sixty five (365)* days from the effective date of the contract. Price increase requests shall be submitted in writing to the Contract Manager, which shall include the reason(s) for the request and contain supporting documentation for the need. Price increases will be negotiated and agreed to by both the State and Vendor in advance of any price increase going into effect. The State is not obligated to accept pricing adjustments or increases and reserves the right to accept or reject them in part or in whole. Price de-escalation or decreases may be requested by the State at any time.

It is understood and agreed that work will be completed at the established contract prices in effect until an amendment date is in effect. Invoicing that deviates from this provision may result in contract cancellation.
