

Fayetteville Street Background


- 1991: The Downtown Raleigh Streetscape Master Plan was adopted by City Council.
- 2006: Fayetteville Street reopened to vehicular traffic and new streetscape design.
 - Established as the city's Ceremonial corridor by the Livable Streets Plan.
 - Major capital project with prescriptive streetscape details.
 - No adopted streetscape plan for Fayetteville Street.






Fayetteville Street Background




Existing Streetscape Elements

Project Background

This project has two significant deliverables.

- Fayetteville Street Streetscape Plan
 - 1. Plan needs to follow at a minimum the UDO requirements outlined in Section 10.2.19.
 - 2. Plan need to be illustrative and user-friendly and provide administrative flexibility.
 - 3. At a minimum identify furnishing, activity zones, and crosssection.
- 2. Engineering Study of Existing Conditions & Utility Plans
 - 1. Understand subsurface conditions, including utilities, irrigation, basements, and above surface of newspaper racks and other built infrastructure.
 - Develop a plan for relocation and consolidations of utilities, planting, and lighting strategies.

Scope of Services

Project Management / Administration

Inventory and Analysis of Existing Conditions

- 1. Review existing furnishings, public art, hardscape elements, infrastructure, accessibility features, lighting, and vegetation.
- 2. Inventory and condition of sub-surface infrastructure, utilities, roof drains, irrigation systems, and overall condition underneath pavers.

3. Fayetteville Street Streetscape Plan

- 1. Identify plan and cross-sections of the corridor, including furnishing and activity zones.
- 2. Provide general specifications of proposed elements while being written to provide administrative alternates in design.
- 3. Develop a street lighting plan and street planting plan.
- 4. Develop a plan for planter and potential newspaper kiosk removal and relocation.
- 5. Evaluate additional accessibility infrastructure.
- 6. Evaluate additional public art locations.
- 7. Optional: Pattern Language Section.



Scope of Services

4. Fayetteville Street Utility Plan and Cost Estimates

- 1. Develop an electrical service, irrigation, and lighting plan.
- 2. Develop cost estimates for the removal and replacement of streetscape elements.
- 3. Develop cost estimates for any alteration of the streetscape such as new planting locations and curb bump outs.

5. Stakeholder Outreach and Meeting Presentations

- Conduct stakeholder outreach and engagement facilitation including public meetings, pop-up events and presentations.

Q & A

Questions from the Pre-Submittal Meeting

What is the project budget?

The ultimate funding strategy is still being decided as there are potential funding streams being allocated to other capital projects in Downtown Raleigh, such as shading elements in City Plaza. The anticipated overall budget should be around or under \$400k with any additional remaining funding going towards implementation of the recommendations from the study.

How much of City Plaza will be included in the scope of work?

- City Plaza should be included in the scope of work. The study should look to evaluate the exiting conditions of the plaza and look at opportunities to expand recommended items from the Downtown Raleigh Economic Development Strategy | Part 1: Activating Fayetteville Street and elements such as public art.
- The streetscape plan should address the plaza and at a minimum include zones of activity, cross-sections, and material and furniture choices.

Is Downtown Raleigh Alliance included in the RFQ selection panel?

- No, Downtown Raleigh Alliance (DRA) will not be a member of the selection panel. DRA was given the opportunity to review the RFQ and will serve as a member of the city's project team.

What is the level of anticipated coordination with stormwater?

- Existing stormwater facilities should be analyzed and documented as part of the study. Relocation and removal plans of existing infrastructure should note any impacts to stormwater facilities and plan any remediation designs.
- Additional green stormwater infrastructure or similar infrastructure may be included as a recommendation to the enhanced planting strategy.

Does being selected for this project preclude any additional work associated with the design services in this contract?

 No. Firms awarded the design service contract can be awarded additional design or construction work associated with the study. The current funding is not adequate for the full implementation of any proposed streetscape improvements, so a phased approach of implementation is anticipated.

Can you elaborate on the level of public engagement?

- For the project, engagement with stakeholder groups such as the DRA and business and property owners along the corridor will be required as part of the scope of work. Since Fayetteville is treated as Raleigh's Main Street, input from the general public should also be considered.

- The adoption of the streetscape plan is a legislative planning process and requires several engagement touchpoints, including a neighborhood meeting, and public hearings at the Design Review Board and City Council.

What extent does the RFQ include geotechnical services?

- The scope of work includes an analysis of subsurface conditions, in particular to understand the condition of the substructure underneath the paving materials and utility locations. Locations of basements and other subsurface structures are also required as part of the existing conditions analysis.

What is the percentage requirement from MBWE?

- The City has an aspirational goal of 15 percent of the total contract amount to be performed by MWBE businesses on construction and repair projects of \$300,000 or more, and contracts of \$100,000 or more that include any State funding.
- For professional services contracts, the City has no established goals regarding percentage of work completed by MWBE firms. However, the use of MWBE firms is encouraged whenever possible.

What is the preference for a landscape architecture experience.

- A local landscape architect with a North Carolina license is preferred to be involved either as lead or a team member this project to help tie in the legacy of the local heritage and cultural landscape of the site. However, any firm with similar experiences and required qualifications are encouraged to apply.

What is role of Interface Studio (the consultant for the <u>Economic Development Strategy | Part 1: Activating Fayetteville Street</u>) with this proposal?

- Interface Studio was hired by Downtown Raleigh Alliance to develop economic
 development strategies for revitalizing Fayetteville Street, and their report included the
 recommendation of an upgraded streetscape plan. The document should be used as a
 guiding document. However, the deliverables and scope of work from this request are
 separate from each other.
- A vast amount of local engagement was conducted by Interface Studio and Downtown Raleigh Alliance. This project should build off the recommendations of the previous planning efforts as a starting point, and work with the stakeholders to complete the streetscape plan.

Are there CAD files available from the 2006 capital project along Fayetteville Street?

- Limited CAD files are available for the proposed design, and do not represent the entire construction files. As-builts and other documentation are only available via pdfs.

Questions from the Pre-Submittal Meeting - Submitted via Teams

Do you have any existing sub-surface survey data, and if so, what level of detail does it offer? Alternatively, is the goal to develop new sub-surface survey data from scratch as part of the existing conditions analysis?

 The City of Raleigh analyzed the sub-surface conditions of City Plaza in early 2020, and that information may be used in the study. Any subsurface data for Fayetteville Street documented is potentially outdated.

The RFP lists urban forestry as a service item, does the city desire teams to include arborists or will the selected team be utilizing City Arborist staff?

It is beneficial and preferred for the consultant team to have their own tree expert to help develop tree specific recommendations. City staff can help with specific requirements or preferences around trees, but consultant team is expected to propose the design/plan/project with the existing trees in mind. This could also be accomplished by including a local landscape architect with adequate tree knowledge.
